STATEMENT.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that the VICTOR TALKING MACHINE COMPANY, a corporation existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New Jersey, having its main office and doing business at No. 127 North Front street, in the city of Camden, county of Camden, in said State, has adopted and used the trade-mark shown in the accompanying drawing, for sound recording or reproducing machines and parts thereof, talking-machine needles, talking-machine horns and amplifiers, and talking-machine records, in Class 36, Musical instruments and supplies.

The applicant is also the owner of the fol-

lowing United States trade-mark registrations, to wit: No. 34,890, registered July 10, 1900 and No. 88,391, registered September 10, 1912.

The trade-mark has been continuously used in the business of said corporation, or its predecessors from whom it acquired title, since May 24, 1900.

The trade-mark is usually displayed on the goods by attaching a plate or label upon which the same is shown to the goods themselves, or to the boxes, receptacles or packages containing the same.
